
Amsterdam Conference Centre



Location and accessibility

Amsterdam Conference Centre Beurs van Berlage is located in the centre of Amsterdam, on the Damrak, Oude Brugsteeg and Beursstraat, directly facing Amsterdam Central Station, at a short distance of highways and Schiphol airport. The Damrak forms part of a route that gives a visitor to the city a first impression, after leaving the central station. This route, which is called 'the Red Carpet', goes from the Central Station along the Rokin, the Muntplein, the Vijzelstraat/-gracht to the Weteringcircuit.

Public transportation

From Amsterdam Schiphol Airport, you can reach Amsterdam Conference Centre Beurs van Berlage by train or taxi. If you are travelling by train, you can buy a ticket to Amsterdam Centraal Station in the Arrivals Hall of Schiphol. The trains leave four times every hour and the journey takes about fifteen minutes. If you take a taxi, you can state "Beurs van Berlage" as your destination. The address is: Damrak 243. The drive takes about twenty-five minutes.

When you arrive at Amsterdam Centraal Station by train or by tram, Beurs van Berlage is 300 metres away, about a five minute walk. You can see Beurs van Berlage on the Damrak in front of you when you leave the Central Station along the Stationsplein (Station square) and head out towards the Dam from there.

Boat

It is possible to travel to Beurs van Berlage by boat. The nearest dock is next to the Beurs van Berlage at the Damrak. On demand, we can connect you to one of our partners in the boat industry in Amsterdam. Please contact your Event Manager for more information.



Private transportation

In the immediate surroundings of Beurs van Berlage, there are a large number of carparks. In the event of a conference or event, it is possible to order various types of exit tickets for your guests, in the Q-park carpark of the Bijenkorf and the Oosterdok carpark. Five days before the start of your event at the latest, you can notify us of the number of exit tickets you wish to order.

Park & Ride (P+R)

The ideal way to reach the city centre of Amsterdam is to park your car at a P+R-location at the edge of the city, and use public transportation the rest of the way. If you come from the northeast, east or southeast of the Netherlands, it is best to use the P+R Zeeburg. Accessible via Ring A10, exit S114. If you come from the northwest or west of the Netherlands, it is best to park at P+R Sloterdijk. Accessible via Ring A10, exit S103.

Buses/coaches

Please note coaches will be prohibited from using the routes Amstel-Rokin-Damrak and the southern part of the Spuistraat-Nieuwezijds Voorburgwal in the inner city of Amsterdam. There is an exception for coaches who have an end destination within the inner city. For these coaches it remains possible to pick up and drop off passengers under the supervision of stewards at four designated coach stops, which are in vicinity of tourist attractions like canal cruises, museums and other cultural institutions. From the bus stop you can reach the Beus van Berlage via the Damrak. Coach drivers who do not have an end destination within the inner city of Amsterdam will risk a fine of \notin 90 by using the prohibited routes. Valet parking

The Valet Parking Service offers a care-free reception of your guests. Your guests are welcomed by a host/hostess. The vehicle is taken over by one of the valet parkers and is parked safely at a suitable parking space nearby. The guest does not have to worry about a parking space and does not have to cross a great distance between the parking space and the Beurs van Berlage. Disabled access

Beurs van Berlage is largely accessible for disabled people. Unfortunately, Beurs van Berlage has no special disabled parking spaces. However, there is a Bijenkorf carpark right next to Beurs van Berlage. The Beurs van Berlage Toren (Tower) is only accessible by stairs.

Change in approach routes

Due to roadworks in the city centre, there will be some changes in the approach routes towards the Beurs.

Construction work Oosterdokstraat


Until March 2019, the Oosterdoksstraat will be closed for traffic. The approach route for all traffic (parking garage and logistic supply- and removal for companies and institutions on Oosterdokseiland) wil be via the Oosterdoksstraat entrance at the Double Tree hotel. The route runs from Piet Heinkade - Kattenburgerstraat -Prins Hendrikkade - ODE bridge to the Oosterdoksstraat.

Construction work Singel

Until 15th July 2018, there will be construction works on the Singel, whereby the part between café Cobalt and Kaasland will be closed.

Construction work Amstel

Until the 1st of November 2018, the Amstel will be reconstructed and the Beurs van Berlage will no longer be accessible via the Amstel. Because the city center will be no longer accessible due to this measure, the Munt is opened up in the northern direction during the reconstruction of the Amstel. The driving route for cars will be Stadhouderskade - Vinzelgracht - Vijzelstraat - Munt -Rokin - Damrak.



Routes centre loading and unloading traffic from 22nd July

In addition to the opening of the North-South line, the bicycle parking garage, the new Beursplein and the bicycle parking ban that will be introduced in our area, the loading and unloading routes will also change. This as a result of the traffic measures around the Prins Hendrikkade, Nieuwezijds Voorburgwal and the Paleisstraat. Below a handy map with the changes as of July 21st.

- Driving to the Damrak can then only go from Dam Square to Damrak
- Driving from the Victoria Hotel onto the Damrak's doorstep is no longer possible
- Note: The activities and closure of the Amstel until the end of November are not on this map
- For the Nieuwezijds Voorburgwal, there are time windows for approaching from the Raadhuisstraat
